Q7. What extracurricular activities are available for primary students?

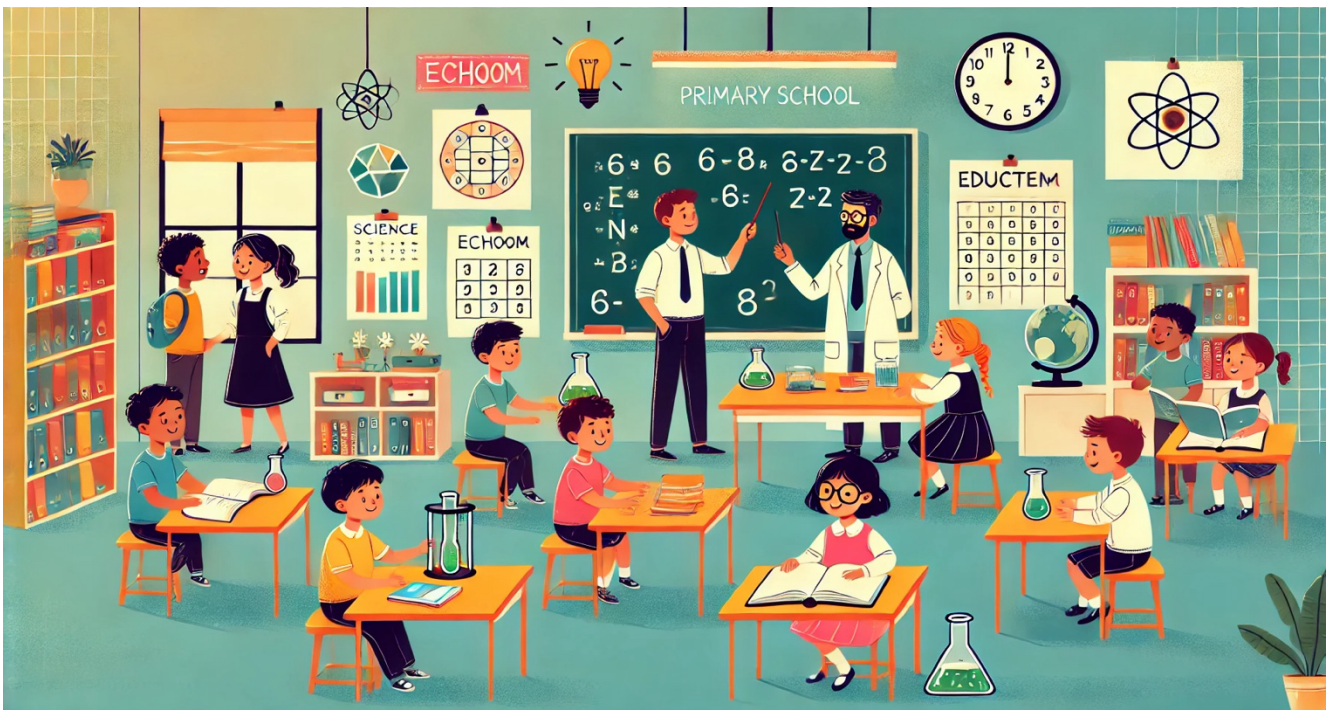
A7. Opportunities include sports, arts, music, drama, and science clubs. Specific offerings depend on the school's program.
